

Daily Morning Prayer: Rite One

Fifth Sunday in Lent

March 29, 2020

The Officiant begins the service with:

“Rend your heart, and not your garments, and turn unto the Lord your God; for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger and of great kindness, and repenteth him of the evil.” *Joel 2:13*

Confession of Sin

BCP 41

The Officiant says to the people:

Let us humbly confess our sins unto Almighty God.

Officiant and People say together:

**Almighty and most merciful Father,
we have erred and strayed from thy ways like lost sheep,
we have followed too much the devices and desires of our own
hearts, we have offended against thy holy laws,
we have left undone those things which we ought to have done,
and we have done those things which we ought not to have done.
But thou, O Lord, have mercy upon us,
spare thou those who confess their faults,
restore thou those who are penitent,
according to thy promises declared unto mankind
in Christ Jesus our Lord;
and grant, O most merciful Father, for his sake,
that we may hereafter live a godly, righteous, and sober life,
to the glory of thy holy Name. Amen.**

The Officiant says:

The Almighty and merciful Lord grant us absolution and remission of all our sins, true repentance, amendment of life, and the grace and consolation of his Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

The Invitatory and Psalter

BCP 42

Officiant: O Lord, open thou our lips.

People: **And our mouth shall show forth thy praise.**

Officiant and People:

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit: as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be for ever. Amen.

Antiphon: The Lord is full of compassion and mercy: O come, let us adore him.

Venite *Psalm 95:1-7; 96:9, 13*

BCP 44

said in unison:

O come, let us sing unto the Lord; let us heartily rejoice in the strength of our salvation.

Let us come before his presence with thanksgiving, and show ourselves glad in him with psalms.

For the Lord is a great God, and a great King above all gods.

In his hand are all the corners of the earth, and the strength of the hills is his also.

The sea is his and he made it, and his hands prepared the dry land.

O come, let us worship and fall down and kneel before the Lord our Maker.

For he is the Lord our God, and we are the people of his pasture and the sheep of his hand.

O worship the Lord in the beauty of holiness; let the whole earth stand in awe of him.

For he cometh, for he cometh to judge the earth, and with righteousness to judge the world and the peoples with his truth.

Antiphon: The Lord is full of compassion and mercy: O come, let us adore him.

Psalm 130

De profundis

- 1 Out of the depths have I called to you, O LORD; LORD, hear my voice; let your ears consider well the voice of my supplication.
- 2 If you, LORD, were to note what is done amiss, O LORD, who could stand?
- 3 For there is forgiveness with you; therefore you shall be feared.
- 4 I wait for the LORD; my soul waits for him; in his word is my hope.
- 5 My soul waits for the LORD, more than watchmen for the morning, more than watchmen for the morning.
- 6 O Israel, wait for the LORD, for with the LORD there is mercy;
- 7 With him there is plenteous redemption, and he shall redeem Israel from all their sins.

At the end of the Psalm is said:

Glory to the Father, and the Son, and to the Holy Spirit: as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be for ever. Amen.

The Lessons

The people reply: **Thanks be to God.**

The **First Lesson** is a reading from **Ezekiel 37:1-14**.

O Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father, that takest away the sins
of the world, have mercy upon us.

Thou that takest away the sins of the world, receive our prayer.

Thou that sittest at the right hand of God the Father, have mercy upon
us.

For thou only art holy, thou only art the Lord, thou only, O Christ, with
the Holy Ghost, art most high in the glory of God the Father.

Amen.

The **Gospel Lesson** is a reading from **John 11:1-45**.

The Apostles' Creed

BCP 53

Officiant and People say together:

I believe in God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth;

And in Jesus Christ his only Son our Lord; who was conceived by the Holy Ghost, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, dead, and buried. He descended into hell. The third day he rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven, and sitteth on the right hand of God the Father almighty. From thence he shall come to judge the quick and the dead. I believe in the Holy Ghost, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

Officiant and People:

redemption of the world by our Lord Jesus Christ, for the means of grace, and for the hope of glory.

And, we beseech thee, give us that due sense of all thy mercies, that our hearts may be unfeignedly thankful; and that we show forth thy praise, not only with our lips, but in our lives, by giving up our selves to thy service, and by walking before thee in holiness and righteousness all our days; through Jesus Christ our Lord, to whom, with thee and the Holy Ghost, be all honor and glory, world without end. Amen.
