From the Pastor

Adjusting Our Sails

During the early days of the Covid-19 pandemic, one of the metaphors that kept coming up in conversation with folks in church was the idea that we were repairing the plane while it was already in flight. We had to constantly adjust the plans we were making and rethink the approaches we were taking. If you had a plan for that first spring of 2020 it was long gone, and you had to quickly come up with alternative plans. I remember thinking how important it was to maintain a sense of adaptability while at the same time fighting for stability. It was a nightmare most of the time. But it reminded many of us of the value of making adjustments while striving to maintain course.

For very different reasons, we find ourselves in the middle of adjusting our sails here at St. Thomas as well. Any time there is a changing of pastoral leadership there are the necessary adjustments just to simply get used to the new personnel. Our family's situation has proven another gust of disruptive wind that we have needed to work with. We joyfully began work here at St. Thomas on July 2 and only a few days later we found out that my wife Caitlin has breast cancer. A few days after that we found out that it wasn't just cancer, but that it had already advanced to stage IV. Every week with tests and procedures we've learned more and each week we've had to adjust the sails again. We've had to rethink what ministry life looks like in this kind of season. We've had to find ways to juggle the appointments, work events, and wrangling our three precious daughters as we adjust to whole new rhythms of life for them. We've made all of these minor and major adjustments to keep things moving forward. Just like the old days, we are again repairing the plane in flight.

But we are still flying. The boat is still up and running. Even in the midst of the chaos, we have new energy and direction in our church and people are stepping up. Folks are stepping up to help with our family, yes, but also to keep things running well here at the church. We have new ideas and programs still starting up, like the adult forum and the Bible study starting this month. We have new and old ways of engaging our community, like the street festival and the Halloween book giveaway. We are listening to parishioners and trying to shape effective programming that meets our congregation's concerns, like the Holy Cow Survey and the upcoming listening sessions. We may be adjusting our sails, but it's been amazing to see us maintain course.

Christ who walks upon the waters has called us to step out. Even in the midst of the chaos, to follow Him. To walk with Him into ministry here in Orange, to deepen our faith, celebrate in worship, and listen deeply to His Call. I am thrilled to listen to that call with you all. May God grant us courage, strength, and peace for the journey ahead.

UPDATING OUR PRAYER MINISTRY

Prayer is one of the central aspects of the Christian life. Prayer is the lifeblood of the church and the heart of what we do when we gather together as a congregation. Prayer is also a gift. It is a practice of self-offering and opening the heart. It is deeply personal and in many cases one of the intimacies of our shared life. With all of these in mind, we will be making a slight update to the process of our prayer request ministry.

One of the slight changes is that all new prayer requests that we publish in the newsletter and bulletins moving forward will be made with consent. Because we are a public organization, with open documents it is appropriate to make sure that the people we are praying for are aware that their names, even if it's only their first name, are being published. This will usually be as simple as someone requesting to put a name on the list and John in the office simply asking, "Do they know that we will be publishing their name in the bulletin?". This lair or formality may seem odd at first, but it is a kindness to ask for permission. Like any gift, it is best given when desired. The only other slight change is that we will be checking in with those being prayed for every few months to inquire if they would like to be prayed for continually. 
